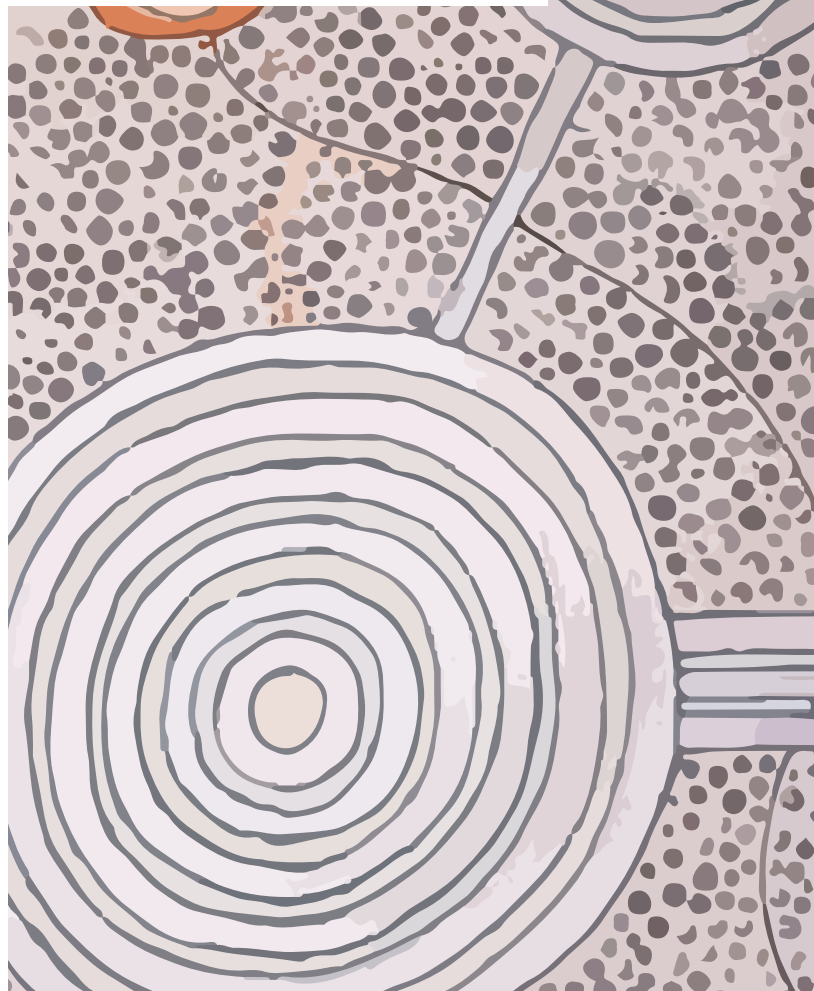

WELCOME

Welcome to the 2020 Chemist Warehouse WNBL season, a season like no other.

When the severity of the COVID-19 pandemic started to take hold on life as we know it here in Australia, Basketball Australia (BA) and the eight WNBL clubs owners via their participation on the WNBL Commission, came together to discuss what the options were for the 2020-21 Chemist Warehouse WNBL season.

We unanimously agreed it was critical to deliver the season and ensure the league puts a much-needed smile on the face of our fans and members, maintains the growth of women's basketball throughout Australia, and continues to inspire future generations of players, coaches and officials. All of this as basketball finds itself on the doorstep of the 2021 Tokyo Olympics where the Chemist Warehouse Australian Opals are eyeing glory again and, just twelve months later, the 2022 FIBA Women's Basketball World Cup will be hosted by Sydney

A number of models and options were explored as to what the season could look like, and through the support of the Queensland Government along with Cairns Regional Council, Mackay Regional Council and the City of Townsville, BA was able to confirm the 2020 Chemist Warehouse WNBL season would be played exclusively out of a North Queensland hub.

Cairns, Mackay and Townsville will play host a revised season model featuring 60 games of world-class women's basketball inside six-weeks from November 11 to December 20, which includes a four game Finals Series to be contested in Townsville.

You don't know what you can't see, and with all but one of the eight clubs playing away from their core fan-base this season, ensuring the league secured a strong broadcast deal was more important than ever.

In October, BA announced the broadcast arrangements for the 2020 Chemist Warehouse WNBL season which provides the league with more visibility than ever before.

Thanks to the Foxtel Group and the ABC, all 60 games of the season will be available LIVE across Australia and in fan-friendly timeslots.

To play a season out of a geographic hub comes with a lot of hard work and enormous sacrifice, and BA acknowledges the many sacrifices that the players, coaches, officials, club administrators and league staff will be making to ensure the season goes ahead. That is why BA has put in place a series of wellbeing structures and processes to provide holistic support to all attending the hub.

One of those structures is to increase team rosters by two athletes, in an effort to prevent injuries and manage player loads. With the inclusion of an additional 16 development players across the league in season 2020, we are also providing an opportunity for stars of the future to play alongside the biggest names in Australian women's basketball.

Playing a full season out of a hub model does put financial pressures on all parties, with all league stakeholders having to make tough decisions during the off-season to support the delivery of the season.

These difficult decisions were made in the collective agreement that it's vital a season went ahead in 2020 and I would like to acknowledge the playing group, via the Australian Basketball Players' Association who agreed to a uniform pay reduction of 15%, with those athletes already on a minimum player payment excluded from this modified agreement.

While the past six months has been filled with challenges and obstacles, we enter the 2020 Chemist Warehouse WNBL in a strong position because of the unified and pragmatic approach all stakeholders have taken in seeking positive outcomes.

It all makes for a compelling and inspirational 41st edition of Australia's longest running women's sporting competition, the Chemist Warehouse WNBL.

BROADCAST INFORMATION

On October 30, 2020, Basketball Australia announced new broadcast arrangements for the 2020 Chemist Warehouse WNBL season, providing the league with more visibility than ever before.

The agreement with partners the Foxtel Group and the ABC will see all 60 games of the 2020 season available LIVE across Australia.

Fox Sports will broadcast LIVE four games per week (7.00pm AEDT Thursday, 5.00pm AEDT Saturday, 1.00pm AEDT Sunday and 3.00pm AEDT Sunday) on Foxtel and Kayo, with the ABC simulcasting on both their primary channel and ABC iview the 5.00pm Saturday and 3.00pm Sunday games.

In addition to streaming the games that will be broadcast on Foxtel, Kayo will also stream LIVE all remaining games of the 2020 season which will involve multi-camera and expert commentary.

Never before has a broadcast agreement which covers all games been so important, with BA announcing earlier this month that in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the 2020 Chemist Warehouse WNBL season would be played exclusively out of a North Queensland hub from November 11 – December 20 inclusive.

Basketball Australia CEO Jerril Rechter AM explained the significance of this broadcast agreement for Australian women's basketball.

"This broadcast agreement with Fox Sports, Kayo and the ABC will provide the Chemist Warehouse WNBL with more exposure than ever before."

"Having all 60 games of the 2020 season shown live across Australia will provide a platform to showcase one of world's leading basketball leagues featuring Australia's best established and emerging athletes. This high-profile visibility across Australia will help build upon the popularity and growth of women's basketball and inspire a whole new generation."

"Basketball Australia would like to thank Foxtel and the ABC for their committed support of the Chemist Warehouse WNBL and we look forward to delivering a highly successful season both on and off the court," concluded Rechter.

Basketball Australia Head of Women in Basketball Lauren Jackson AO said this broadcast agreement provides a platform for Australians to become fans of the country's leading basketballers.

"The Australian Opals and our Under 19 women's team are both ranked world number two and this broadcast arrangement will enable all Australians to witness the skill, strength and athleticism of our players."

"The 2020 Chemist Warehouse WNBL season will double as important preparation for the Australian Opals ahead of the Tokyo Olympics and the 2022 FIBA Basketball World Cup which will be hosted by Sydney."

"With all the opportunities that this season presents us, being able to broadcast all our games live across the nation was at the top of the list. This is a wonderful outcome for Women's Basketball in Australia, and we are thankful for the support of both Foxtel and the ABC," concluded Jackson.

Fox Sports Executive Director Steve Crawley, said: *"Women's basketball is a source of inspiration and excitement for Australians of every age group. We are stoked to be the home of the WNBL in 2020 bringing every game of the season live to a record number of sports fans watching on Foxtel and Kayo."*

Director of ABC Regional & Local Judith Whelan, said: "We're thrilled to welcome back the WNBL to the ABC – the natural home of women's sport in Australia. We are also delighted that one of this country's most experienced and passionate basketball commentators, the ABC's Corbin Middlemas, will be part of this season's on-air WNBL commentary team. The ABC is looking forward to bringing Australian fans two games per week of one of the best women's basketball competitions in the world."

The 2020 Chemist Warehouse WNBL season is supported by the Queensland Government along with Cairns Regional Council, Mackay Regional Council and the City of Townsville.

Queensland Tourism Minister Kate Jones said the deal announced today was a great win for North Queensland.

"Basketball is growing in popularity right throughout Australia. Having the WNBL season broadcast throughout the country on live television will deliver a shot-in-the-arm for our tourism industry at a time we need it most."

"You can't beat the beauty of north Queensland and the Great Barrier Reef in Spring."

"This deal will ensure that images of Queensland's most idyllic locations will be pumped into the living rooms of thousands of sports fans throughout the country."

"Generating more exposure for Queensland is an important part of our economic recovery plan – ensuring that more tourists return to Queensland as soon as possible."

MEDIA INFORMATION

Basketball Australia (BA) manages all media and photographer accreditations for WNBL matches, including the home and away season and Finals Series.

BA is responsible for managing the accreditation approvals/denials for all media representatives within the deadlines defined by BA.

BA requires that all media register in BA Accreditation Portal and have an up-to-date profile. Distribution of media accreditation may be subject to BA final approval.

Guidelines for Accredited Media

- Media must wear the appropriate accreditation pass at all times in the match venue.
- Media must conduct their work solely from within designated areas determined by the host team's Media Liaison at each venue.
- Working space on the media bench may be allocated by the host team's Media Liaison.
- Media may not approach players, coaches or officials, or enter the playing arena, during the match.
- Media may attend the official post-match press conference at the venue, with representatives from both teams in attendance.

Guidelines for Accredited Photographers

- The photographer must wear the appropriate accreditation pass and official photographic bib (issued at the venue) by the home team's Media Liaison at all times in the venue. All bibs must be returned at the conclusion of the match.
- Specific photographer pool positions may be allocated by the home team's Media Liaison.
- No photographer may enter the field of play, unless at the direction of the home team's Media Liaison.
- The use of flash photography is strictly prohibited.
- Monopods are permitted, but not tripods.
- Photographers are permitted to shoot from the stadium bowl but must not impact the viewing of spectators.
- Any photographs taken during the accredited event must not be provided to sponsors or similar without the prior consent of Basketball Australia or the host team.
- Access to gantries or elevated positions at various venues is subject to approval from the Operations Manager, the host team and venue management. Any photographer wishing to access these high-risk areas will require to prove they have Personal Indemnity Insurance of \$AUD 10 million. It may be a requirement to undertake occupational health and safety training at the venue.

Special Broadcast Conditions

- Only rights holding broadcasters are permitted to film or commentate on WNBL matches within official venues.
- News crews are permitted to film the official post-match press conference but are not permitted to film anywhere else in the stadium.
- The use of all television or photographic cameras and radio broadcast equipment must be approved by Basketball Australia before entering the venue. No radio commentary or audio streaming of any match is permitted without the express permission of Basketball Australia.
- Live streaming inside official WNBL venues (including Instagram, Facebook and other technologies) by media outlets is strictly prohibited. Only digital rights holding broadcasters and Basketball Australia representatives are permitted to live stream inside the venue.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF MEDIA ACCREDITATION

As at 2 November 2020

By applying for media accreditation, I hereby acknowledge and agree on behalf of myself and as an authorized signatory on behalf of my employee and parent company that in consideration of Basketball Australia (BA) granting me permission to attend and or cover the 2020 Chemist Warehouse WNBL season, I will agree to observe the following terms and conditions:

Specific terms for non-rights holders including digital media

- Accredited television and digital media cannot film pieces to camera from within the venue for news reporting purposes but can do so from outside of the venue's official perimeter.
- Accredited Radio and Audio Media can conduct live and or pre-record crosses from within the venue for news reporting purposes but must seek prior permission for BA.
- Accredited media will have access to official event media areas and opportunities, including but not limited to press conferences and mixed zones where vision, audio and photos obtained have no limitations (subject to compliance with other restrictions outlined).
- Accredited media agree to comply with Australian law and in particular the fair dealing provisions of the Australian Copyright Act
- Accredited media agree to comply with the "passing off" limitations contained in the same Act

Specific terms for Photographers

1. Only accredited photographers will be entitled to cover the season with a strict "no flash" policy.
2. Where photographers can be positioned will vary from venue to venue, where the Venue Media Manager will provide guidance on the day. Note – due to space restrictions, photographers cannot file from side of court.
3. Accredited photographers will need to follow any instructions from the event media team with respect to restrictions.
4. Accredited photographers will take only still photographs and will not make any video or audio-only recordings.
5. Any accredited photographers will also comply with the "passing off" limitations contained in the same Act.

Relevant to all media including photographers

1. All accredited media will comply with QLD Health's COVIDSafe protocols and in turn, the COVIDSafe protocols as implemented by the event owners, BA and engaged third parties.
2. All accredited media:
 - will comply with any directions of BA, the event party, venue staff, or venue security
 - conduct themselves in a way that will not cause offence to, or otherwise inhibit the enjoyment of, any other person, including other accredited personnel, media, rights holders, players, teams or patrons at the venue
 - are subject to the terms of the BA Privacy Policy and National Integrity Framework (particularly to the extent that any information accredited media obtains by virtue of their accreditation will only be used for bona fide news editorial reporting and will not be used for betting on the outcome of a WNBL game or any element of a WNBL game or to induce any other person to do the same).
3. Media accreditation, whether approval for or the physical credential, is non-transferable.
4. Accredited media will have access to official event media areas and opportunities where vision, audio and photos obtained have no limitations (subject to compliance with other restrictions outlined).

Indemnity

1. I agree to indemnify and hold harmless BA, the venue, the WNBL Clubs and each of their employees, contractors, officers and agents against any loss, claim, expense or damage to BA, the Venue, the WNBL Clubs or any of their employees, contractors officers and agents resulting from a breach of these Terms by the Applicant (whether or not the Applicant is acting within the scope of any employment or contract) or resulting from the revocation of accreditation by BA.
2. I acknowledge and agrees that I shall move in and around the venue at my own risk.
3. I understand and agree that access to the venue will be refused and/or accreditation will be revoked if I, in the opinion of BA, am noticeably under the influence of alcohol, narcotics, stimulants or any behaviour- modifying substance, is behaving or is likely to behave violently, harmfully or in a manner contrary to public order, or if my appearance or behaviour negatively affects the public standing of the WNBL or BA.
4. I understand and agree that I am strictly prohibited from using, possessing or holding promotional or commercial, political, religious or racist objects and materials, offering to sell, selling or possessing with intent to sell goods such as drinks, food, souvenirs, clothes, promotional and/or commercial items at any time in or at the venue.

I, the undersigned, currently hold adequate public liability insurance and will provide proof of such coverage upon request.

I release, indemnify and hold harmless, BA and their respective employees, contractors, representatives, and agents, from all actions, suits, causes of action, claims and demands whatsoever and from all liability arising from my entry into, and my activities under this agreement, whether or not such liability is wholly or partly caused by their negligent acts or omissions.

2020 RULE CHANGES

On November 7 2020, Basketball Australia (BA) announced the introduction of an Instant Review System (IRS) for the 2020 Chemist Warehouse WNBL season.

To be utilised during feature games broadcast on Foxtel and the ABC, the IRS will provide game day officials with the ability to review a call in real time. The IRS will be solely used at the discretion of game day referees to verify if a questioned decision is correct.

Through collaborative work with the league's production partner, Rainmaker and broadcast partners, Foxtel and the ABC, referees will be able to access five camera angles for examination on the respective call.

In the instance that a referee calls for a review, they must first indicate their initial decision before reviewing game vision, with the final call only to be varied if the recorded game vision provides 'clear and conclusive' evidence that a correction is required.

All reviews will be carried out by the game day referees, with assistance to video equipment or vision provided by the attending broadcast crew.

BA Head of Education and Development Michael Haynes explained the introduction of the system will be of benefit to WNBL referees in a season full of firsts.

"We are delighted to have the Instant Review System available for 21 of our Chemist Warehouse WNBL games this season, thanks to joint efforts of the league's production and broadcast partners.

"The Instant Review System is for referees to utilise if they wish to verify a game decision such as whether a successful shot was two or three points. We strive to provide our referees with the technology and resources to feel confident in every decision they make on the court," concluded Haynes.

The induction of an IRS sees the Chemist Warehouse WNBL follow in the footsteps of the International Basketball Federation (FIBA), who currently use the IRS in all major international competitions.

Further to the implementation of the IRS, the Chemist Warehouse WNBL will also apply additional minor rule changes this season that FIBA introduced from 1 October 2020. These changes include:

- If a player is fouled while attempting to shoot the basketball, yet then proceed to pass the ball, they are deemed to no longer be in the act of shooting.
- The act of shooting on a stationary shot begins when in the judgment of the referee, the player starts to move the ball upward toward the opponent's basket. The act of shooting in a continuous movement (e.g. lay-up) begins when the ball has come to rest in the hand or hands of the player.
- The rules now define the offensive player's cylinder (their position on the court) whereas the rules previously only defined the cylinder of the defensive player. This is more by way of clarification and it is not anticipated that it will change how the game is officiated.

In accordance with the updates and new rules, BA has conducted education sessions with teams and officials in the lead up to season tip off.

COMPETITION CONCEPT

Overview of competition structure compete – once finalised will edit

MATCH FORMAT

Matches will consist of four quarters of 10 minutes each. There will be an interval between each quarter, lasting for two (2) minutes, except the half-time interval (between the 2nd and 3rd quarter) which will last for 12 minutes depending on broadcast scheduling

PLAYER STATUS

Restricted players are NOT allowed to participate in the 2020 season. A restricted player is any player born outside the FIBA Asia/Oceania Region.

Any foreign born player that holds Permanent Residency in Australia shall be entitled to play in the WNBL as an unrestricted player.

WNBL LADDER

The positions on the ladder during the regular season shall be determined by win/loss percentage.

Should two or more teams be tied with the same win/loss percentage during the regular season they shall be ranked by Head to Head results between the tied teams.

If 2 or more teams have the same win-loss record of all games at the end of the season, the game(s) between these 2 or more teams shall decide the final placings. If these 2 or more teams have the same win-loss record of the games between them, further criteria shall be applied in the following order:

- Higher game points difference of the games between them
- Higher number of game points scored in the games between them
- Higher game points difference of all games during the season
- Higher number of game points scored in all games in the group

If at any level of this criteria one or more teams ladder position is determined as a result of the above criteria, the procedure shall be repeated from the beginning for all the remaining teams not classified yet until all ladder positions are determined.

PLAYER ELIGIBILITY FOR WNBL FINALS

To be eligible to play in finals, a player must have played a minimum of one-third of the regular season for the same Chemist Warehouse WNBL club.

A Chemist Warehouse WNBL club cannot register a new player when less than one-third of the regular season remains to be played by that team, unless replacing a player under an injury waiver.

When calculating player's games played, a player's name must be on the score sheet, be in the respective team's playing uniform, seated on team bench and be medically fit to participate in the game.

GAME ABANDONMENT

At any stage of a game the referees and/or game commissioner may abandon the game due to security and welfare concerns of players, officials and spectators.

The following formulae be used to determine the result for a game that cannot be completed.

- A 20 + point margin will mean that the result will stand at the scoreline when the game was abandoned, at any point of the game.
- A margin less than 20 points before half time will mean the game is abandoned and league management will determine if game is to be replayed.
- A margin of less than 15 points between half and three-quarter time will mean that the game is abandoned, and league management will determine if game is to be replayed.
- After three-quarter time, the result stands at the scoreline when the game was abandoned.

If the game is abandoned prior to tip off, the league will endeavour to replay the game at a later stage of the season. However, the league will assess if the game is required to be replayed depending on ladder position and if the game is needed to determine playoffs position. If abandoned prior tip off and not replayed, the teams affected by the abandoned game Win/Loss percentage will be determined by one (1) less game.

LEAGUE AWARDS

Along with the statistical awards, the league will also announce the following awards at the competition of the regular season. The season awards are voted on by the Head Coach and Captain of each team from a list of players compiled by the league office. For integrity reasons Coach/Captains may not vote for any player from their own team.

SUZY BATKOVIC MEDAL (LEAGUE MVP)

At the end of each regular season game both coaches and the lead referee conduct a 3-2-1 vote, with the Most Valuable Player being the player with the most votes at the end of the regular season. The Award was renamed as the Suzy Batkovic medal in 2019 to recognise and honour one of the competitions best players in Suzy Batkovic.

COACH OF THE YEAR

Each Club Head coach and team captain casts a vote for first, second and third place selections. Each first-place vote is worth three points; each second-place vote is worth two points; and each third-place vote is worth one point. The person with the highest point total, regardless of the number of first-place votes, wins the award. Number of first-place votes will determine the winner if coaches are tied on total points.

BETTY WATSON AUSTRALIAN YOUTH PLAYER OF THE YEAR

This award is for Australian players competing in the Chemist Warehouse WNBL that are 23 years of age or under at the completion of the season. It will be selected from a list of eligible players that have been selected by each respective coach. Selected at the end of regular season by coaches and team captains, each of whom casts a vote for first, second and third place selections. Each first-place vote is worth three points; each second-place vote is worth two points; and each third-place vote is worth one point. The person with the highest point total, regardless of the number of first-place votes, wins the award. Number of first-place votes will determine the winner if players are tied on total points.

The Award is named in honour of Betty Watson, who was a pioneer for women's basketball in Australia.

ALL WNBL FIRST and SECOND TEAM

The All-WNBL First & Second Teams shall be decided by a vote from all coaches & captains in the league from a list of 20 players that received game MVP votes throughout the regular season. Coach and Captains select a First team and a Second team, making sure they do not select the same player in each team. Players are to be selected based on their performance throughout the season, and not necessarily by position. No more than 2 Restricted players can be selected in each team.

ROBYN MAHER DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Prior to the end of regular season Coaches from each team nominate the two best defensive players within team, then a list is compiled from which each Head Coach and Captain casts a vote for first, second and third place selections. A player from each team must be nominated for the final list. Each first-place vote is worth three points; each second-place vote is worth two points; and each third-place vote is worth one point. The person with the highest point total, regardless of the number of first-place votes, wins the award. The Award is named in honor of one of the leagues greatest players Robyn Maher who was regarded as the best Defensive Player in the league during her playing career in the WNBL.

SIXTH WOMAN OF THE YEAR

Prior to the end of regular season Coaches from each team select the two best 6th player recipients within team, then a list is compiled from which each coach and captain casts a vote for first, second and third place selections. A player from each team must be nominated. Each first-place vote is worth three points; each second-place vote is worth two points; and each third-place vote is worth one point. The person with the highest point total, regardless of the number of first-place votes, wins the award.

Players that have started in 50% or more of the games during the season are not eligible for the award.

STATISTICAL AWARDS

Each WNBL season the league will present statistical awards at the competition of the regular season. Statistical Awards will be awarded to the leading players in the following categories

- Leading Scorer
- Leading Rebounder
- Golden Hands Award

To be eligible for statistical awards, players must have played in at least 50% of the available games played each season. The awards will be given to the player with the highest average for the season.

Golden Hands Award winner is determined by the following equation

$(\text{Total Assists} + \text{Total Steals} - \text{Total Turnovers}) / \text{Games Played} = \text{Golden Hands Award Rating}$

MEDIA AWARDS

These awards highlight the exceptional work done across all media outlets reporting on the league throughout the season. Media are encouraged to nominate for their relevant category with no limits on the amount of submissions.

The award categories are as follows:

- WNBL Basketball Writer of the Year
- Best Newspaper Coverage (including online)
- Best Radio/Podcast Coverage
- Best Feature (Newspaper/Television/Radio/Online)
- Best Photograph

PLAYER AND TEAM OF THE ROUND

After each round of the regular season, WNBL League Management will analysis the results of each game and the player statistics/performance and recognize one athlete as the Player of the Week, along with a selection of the best 5 players who will be recognised as the Team of the Week.

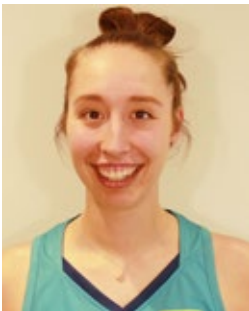

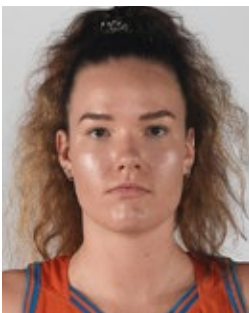

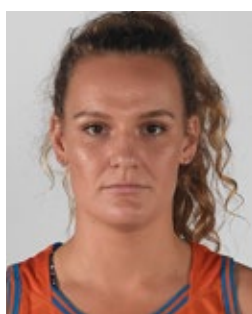
